- The word *charisma* (from *charis*, meaning grace) refers to grace-gifts—spiritual gifts freely given by the Holy Spirit.
- 1 Corinthians 12:4–11 emphasizes three core truths:
 - **Unity of source:** All gifts come from the same Spirit (vv. 4–6).
 - **Sovereignty of God:** The Spirit distributes gifts as *He* determines (v. 11).
 - **Purpose of gifts:** Given for the **common good**, not personal pride (v. 7).
- These supernatural gifts include wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and interpretation.
- **Other spiritual gifts** are also mentioned in Romans 12:6–8, including serving, teaching, encouragement, giving, leadership, and mercy. These too are called *charismata*—gifts of grace given by the Spirit
- Spiritual gifts do **not** equate to spiritual maturity—character development is still essential.
- Chapters 12–14 should be read together, showing that gifts are to be exercised **in love, with order**, and **for edification**.
- Believers are encouraged to **eagerly desire** the gifts (1 Cor 14:1), while practicing discernment and accountability.

1. Unity in Diversity

• Read verses 4–6. How does understanding that all gifts come from the same Spirit shape our attitude toward different roles and abilities in the church?

3. Your Experience

• Have you ever experienced or witnessed a spiritual gift in use (e.g., healing, prophecy, encouragement)? What was your reaction?

• In what ways can your group create a safe and encouraging space to explore and grow in spiritual gifts, while staying grounded in Scripture and love?
